The Freshmen apply their hard earned knowledge to the problem of a small rock in a hole. However, in this case brains were overcome by brawn.

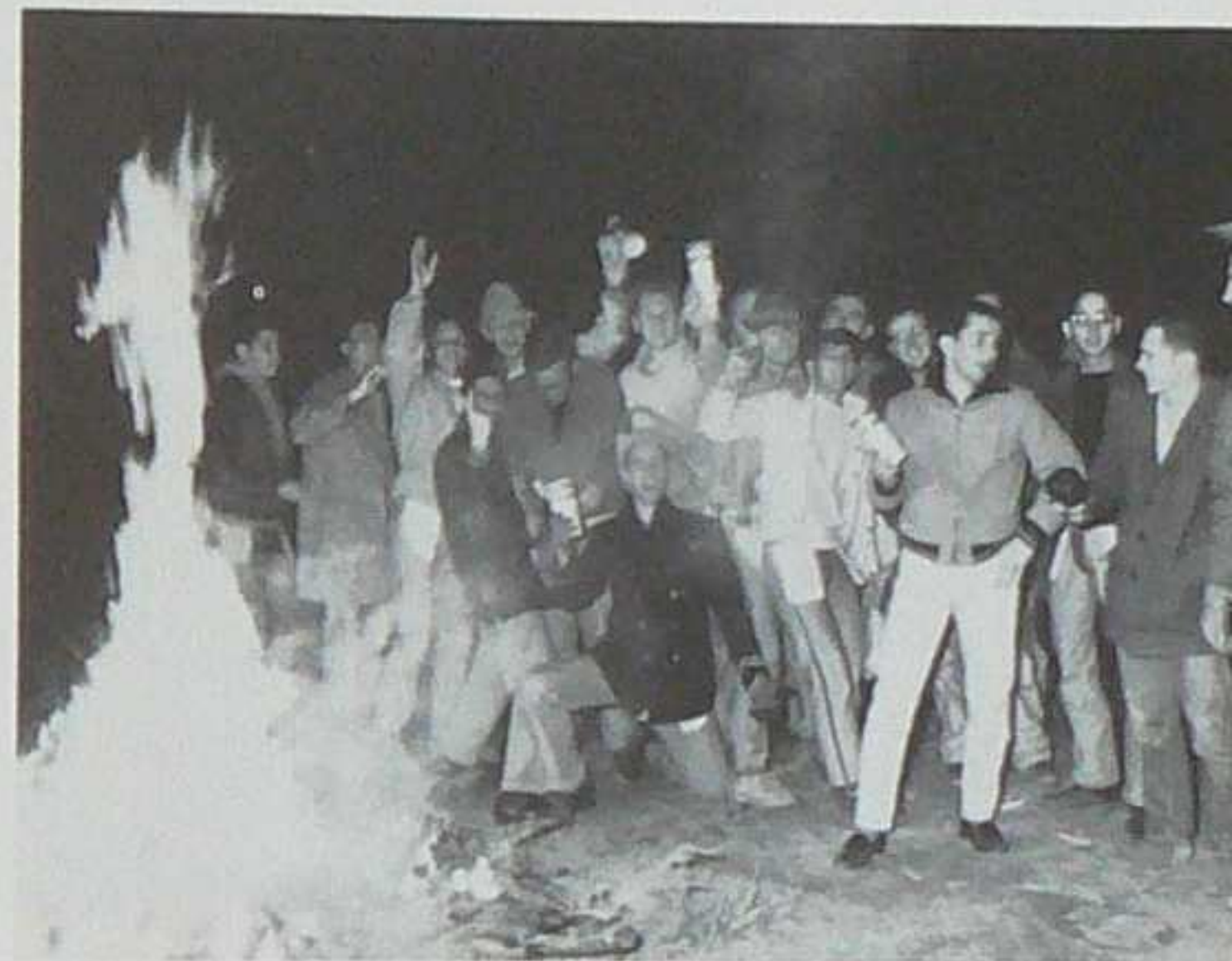

... is embarking on an expanded five-year educational program in the fields of metallurgical, mining, and petroleum engineering.

Freshmen entering NMIMT who plan to qualify for engineering degrees will take the five-year course of study. Present engineering students may graduate under the current program, which leads to Bachelor of Science degrees in the three fields of engineering offered by the Institute. NMIMT students also may obtain Bachelor of Science degrees in chemistry, geology, geophysics, mathematics, physics, and basic sciences.

The Institute also has broadened its scope in several other areas:

- * A Master of Science degree in mathematics has been introduced, bringing to seven the number of fields in which the Institute offers the Master of Science degree. The others are chemistry, geology, physics, geophysics, extractive metallurgy, and ground-water hydrology. The Ph. D. degree in geophysics also is available to students of unusual ability for high achievement and original contributions to knowledge in this field.

- * A high school science and mathematics teacher training program has been launched. Under the program, students may fulfill the minimum requirements in education courses for certification as teachers of science and mathematics on the secondary level.

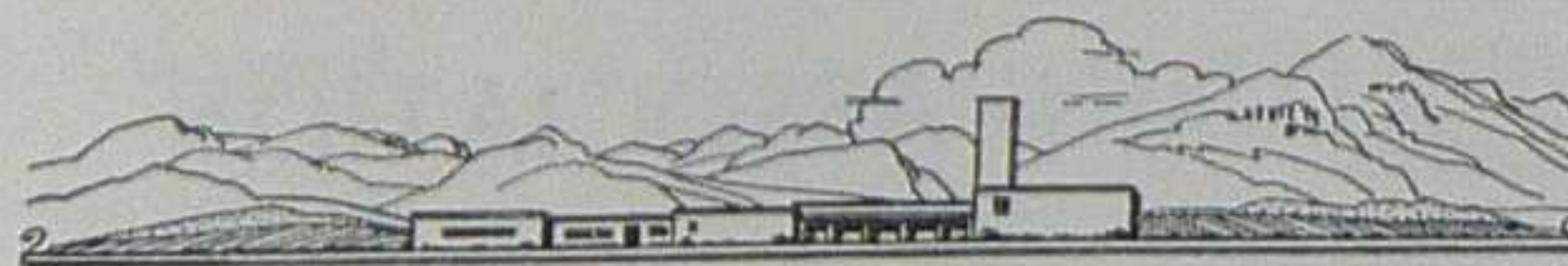
- * A two-year liberal arts program is offered for students who desire to complete two years of basic study at the Institute before transferring to another college to pursue a liberal arts education.

- * Evening classes are held, primarily for adults in the area.

- * Cultural and recreational opportunities are made available, including College Program Series talks and entertainment, seminars, colloquiums, clubs, dramatics, socials, movies, intramural sports, swimming, and golf.

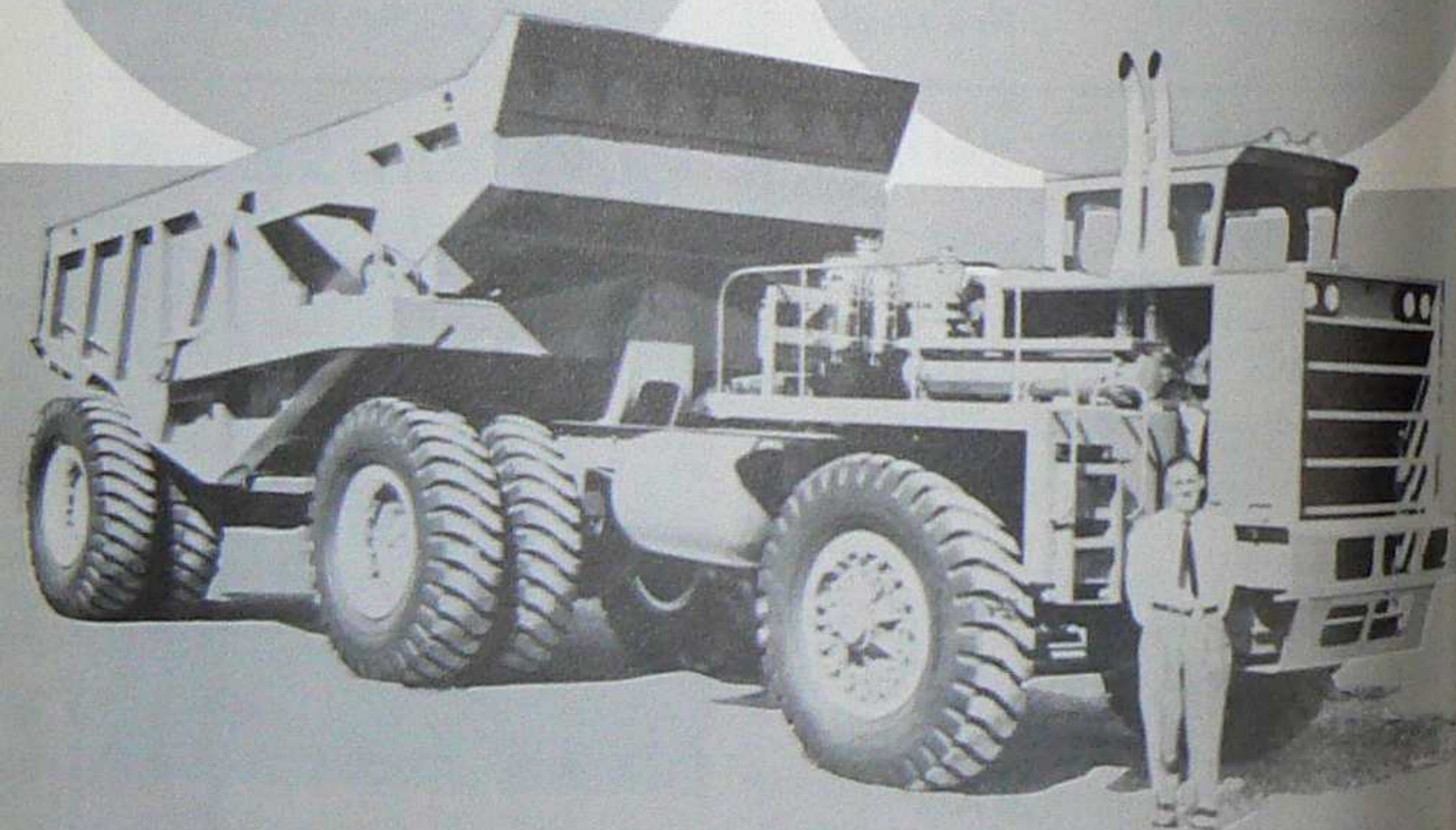
