Consumer Electronics Show 2020

Dear Senate Members,

I would like for you to consider helping the New Mexico Tech IEEE Chapter send members to the Consumer Electronics Show in Las Vegas, NV. This event takes place on January 10, 2020. We intend to leave Thursday January 9 around 10:00am, drive to Las Vegas, and stay in an Airbnb on Thursday and Friday night and return Saturday morning back to Socorro.

We are expecting a maximum amount of 18 people attending, therefore we are planning to use two vans. The total travel to Las Vegas and back will be 1180 miles along with 40 mile in city travel at a 0.6 mile/gallon. The registration for the conference will be free to students. Our approximate travel funds are expected to be \$1464. We are requesting an amount \$910 for housing on AirBnB, which is the cheapest option as compared to other online sites. In addition, we expect to get funding from the regional chapter of \$500 to help cover the cost.

We plan on taking as many members of the IEEE student branch as possible. Attending CES will allow students to be exposed to new and upcoming technologies. CES is an outstanding way for underclassmen to engage in social events and meet big company representatives in order to augment their networking skills.
